We were disappointed to find out that Corby council are not going to bring back the Kier contract in house but will be extending it by a further two years. This despite their appalling treatment of employees, failure to properly maintain the equipment used by our members and their part in the blacklisting scandal. We fear that their conduct will only get worse. Rachelle said she was spending far too much time at Kier sorting out problems caused by their poor behaviour. We will be making our feelings known to the council.

Rajko reported that a meeting had been arranged for early July with Rachelle and Accuma management to sort out the problems being caused by the implementation of the 'living wage' it is still not clear if members are better or worse off.

AOB:

Fergus said that one of his members was still experiencing financial problems caused by the death of the member's daughter. It was agreed that we make a further donation.

Rachelle said that the regional women's conference had gone well. 60 to 65 members had attended. Lily thought it had been very informative and enjoyable and hoped to be able to go to more conferences in the future.
